


Welcome to our 66th Season of theatre. With your help, well over 100,000 students will experience the joy of live, professional theatre as part of their education in the 2020-2021 school year!





Musubi Man



Making Reservations


- Choose which plays you would like to attend and fill out the enclosed Reservation Form, or go to htyweb.org to download a Reservation Form.
