Course Description: This course will emphasize dance/movement exploration, demonstrating how to activate student creativity by tapping into their natural desire to be physically active. Young students want and need to get out of their seats and move their bodies, so their engagement in creative movement activities is high! Dance/movement reveals something about who they are and shows the uniqueness of each individual, so self-esteem and respect for others is nurtured. Students learn that with dance/movement, there is more than one right answer, thus generating open-mindedness to multiple perspectives. Dance develops kinesthetic awareness, self-control and motor skills. It is a non-verbal form of communication and self-expression. It integrates intellectual, physical and emotional parts of ourselves.
