



The Brave Little Turtle: Integrating Drama and Text

Age Level: Elementary

Description: HTY teaching artist Jonathan Sypert demonstrates a variety of simple drama strategies that can be integrated into reading lessons to help build student comprehension of key story elements. The videos can guide teachers how to implement the drama strategies or be used directly with students.

STEP ONE	Watch or read 'The Brave Little Turtle': Part One.	ATT AND BALOU
STEP TWO	Explore Characters with Snapshots Create snapshots (frozen images) of the principal characters of the story.	Read & Play The Brave Little Turtle
STEP THREE	Watch or read 'The Brave Little Turtle': Part Two.	Mis ago Magos
STEP FOUR	Explore Character moments with Action Create actions related to each of the main characters, demonstrating their personality and place in the story.	PLAY!

STEP FIVE	Watch or read 'The Brave Little Turtle': Part Three.	2019-2029 SEASON
STEP SIX	Express Narration to Understand the Problem Creatively play with narration to enhance students' understanding of the central problem of the story.	KIDS a: AY! The humans were throwing trash into the ocean.
STEP SEVEN	Watch or read 'The Brave Little Turtle': Part Four.	
STEP EIGHT	Express Dialogue to Understand the Solution Experiment with various ways to express character dialogue while exploring the story's solution.	Intent CAUT CAUT FOR YOUR WITH THE PLAY! WITH THE PLAY! WITH THE PLAY! WITH THE PLAY!
STEP NINE	Watch or read 'The Brave Little Turtle': Part Five.	THE CALL

STEP TEN	Dramatize a part or all of the story Students act out a portion of the story as Mr. Jonathan (or the teacher) reads, adding action and dialogue that exemplifies their interpretation and understanding of the story situations.	KIDS a LAY!
Auxiliary	Mr. Jonathan reads the full story, showing the text and images as he reads.
