



About the Playwright, Lee Cataluna

Lee Cataluna's stories reflect the
cultural acuity of
an island artist
who grew up
in an international

crossroads. Her work is often uproariously funny, deeply emotional, and tightly wrought.

Her recent work includes commissions from Arena Stage, La Jolla Playhouse, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Dramatic Publishing, Honolulu Theatre for Youth and San Francisco Playhouse. Her plays have been developed at Ojai Playwrights Conference, Chautauqua Institute, Purple Crayon Players at Northwestern University, Atlantic Theater, and Native Voices at the Autry. She was a finalist for the Eugene O'Neill award. Her play Home of the Brave has been performed by school children around the country. Several of her projects have been supported by NEA grants.

She writes plays for children as well as general audiences, and has written for digital theater and television. Many of her plays are about people and things that are not easy to love, and the magic found in everyday life. She has an MFA in Creative Writing from UC Riverside. She is of Native Hawaiian descent and lives in Honolulu.

About the Show

The show is adapted from the beloved book by Sandi Takayama and is designed to foster young children's pre-literacy development. HTY's production gives plenty of opportunity for keiki to interact and help with the storytelling. The show will tour pre-schools, elementary schools, and libraries after its run here at Tenney Theatre.

Reiko Ho is an accomplished director and multi-disciplinary theatre maker from Honolulu, Hawai'i, who loves telling stories that reflect the diverse voices of her island home. Her work has been seen throughout Hawai'i as well as nationally. Reiko is currently Artistic Associate for Honolulu Theatre for Youth, a member of The Consortium of Asian American Theaters & Artists (CAATA), and on the Board of Directors for TYA/USA, the leading national organization in the field of Theatre for Young Audiences.

Junior has performed as a cockroach, crocodile, hula mula dancer, mongoose, monk, demigod, evil stepsister, swordsman, snake, juggler, fish general, fairy, mouse, monkey, ogre, caribou, blacksmith, surfer, p'ansori singer, a rock, a rock wall (twice), King of Troy, musubi, Maui, Aladdin, Spartan knight, dolphin, paleontologist, a fire-breathing sea dragon (three times), Wilbur the pig, a nene, Peter Rabbit, a culinary drill sergeant, a kamikirigami artist, goldfish vendor, B-boy, Robin Hood, a cloud, an invisible reindeer, Inky Blue, star-nosed mole, Xi Xia King, Uncle Billy, a pink unicorn, the red balloon, a Philippine eagle, a garbage truck, Gepetto, a hair brush, a salt farmer, carp, woodcutter, snail, spam musubi, Japanese cumulus cloud, and a cockroach (again).
