



This show is a special collaboration

between Capitol Modern: The Hawai'i State Art Museum and Honolulu Theatre for Youth. Together, we were inspired to create a performance that explores the elements of visual art and how they are found all around us.

In developing the show, we explored all the core elements of art: line, shape, form, texture, value, color, and space. However, we found ourselves especially drawn to line, shape, form, and color—playing with how they connect with one another. Dots create lines, which create shape, which lead to form (3D shapes) and they all are connected to color!

We encourage everyone to *kilo*—
to observe—the world around you.
Art is everywhere, and we hope this
experience inspires you to create,
whether through theatre, music, or
visual art.

Danica is a theatre artist, director, educator, activist, and arts administrator.
